



SAGE Graduate Programme

October 2019 to July 2020

SAGE is a unique leadership programme for aspiring social reformers.

Participants will learn to think biblically about issues in public life, develop research skills and then design a project to help others engage in social transformation. The SAGE Programme is for recent graduates who have a mature Christian character and leadership potential, and is based in the Jubilee Centre's office in Cambridge.

Social Reform – the overall goal

Apprenticeship approach – you learn by doing

Grow professionally – in the context of a Christian think tank

Experience a unique year – as part of a learning community

What are the outcomes?

- Discover the Bible's social vision and how it addresses 21st century issues in public life
- Embrace a framework for Christian social reform based on Relational Thinking
- Learn how and why to base social transformation on thorough research
- Develop skills for biblical and issue-based research and for communication of ideas
- Form and implement a strategy for engaging Christian leaders around the issue
- Grow in personal, social and spiritual maturity

How is SAGE structured?

Study Phase (October to December): You'll learn about how the Bible provides both foundations and objectives for engaging in public life. Modules include the economy, politics, law and justice, family and sexual ethics, the arts and science & technology.

Research Phase (January to April): developing biblical and issue-based research skills as you carry out an in-depth investigation together into one specific issue in public life.



Project Phase (May to July): You will turn your research findings into an appropriate output (e.g. publication, film or workshop) and a strategy that equips and mobilises Christian leaders and wider audiences.

The SAGE programme ends with a four-day Social Reformers Summer School and twice during the year we hope to organise a week away for the participants.

Where will participants live?

The five participants selected to join the SAGE programme will live together in Cherry Hinton, a suburb of Cambridge, which is a 15 minute cycle ride from the Jubilee Centre offices in the city centre.



What does it cost?

Fees for the 2019/20 SAGE programme are £1,800. You will also need around £450/month for accommodation (single room, all bills included), and up to £200/month for food, transport (a bicycle is highly recommended) and other living expenses. The SAGE Programme dates are from 28th Sept 2019 to 20th July 2020 (end date to be confirmed).
